Respectful by serving others and themselves. They value people, possessions and property.


Resilient by showing perseverance when facing new challenges both in their learning and with relationships.

By being **caring** in the way we live out our faith in the service of others.



The St Paul's Way



St Paul is undoubtedly one of the most important figures in the history of the Western world. Just a quick look at the headlines of his life are enough to understand his impact; his works are some of the earliest Christian documents that we have. Thirteen of the twenty seven books of the New Testament were written by him, and he was the hero of another, the Acts of the Apostles.

Famously converted on the road to Damascus, he travelled tens of thousands of miles around the Mediterranean spreading the word of Jesus. It was Paul who came up with the doctrine that would turn Christianity from a small sect of Judaism into a worldwide faith that was open to all. The importance of Paul's conversion, his turn-around from persecuting Jesus to preaching Jesus, cannot be underestimated.

Paul himself finds it difficult to describe what had happened and in a fascinating passage in one of his letters he explains this as a resurrection appearance of Jesus (1 Corinthians 15.8-10). St Paul travelled a wide and varied path on his way to Christianity.

The Damascus Road experience was both a conversion and a calling. It was a conversion away from his previous life as a zealous persecutor of Jesus' followers and it was a call to a new life advancing the cause of the new movement with even more vigour than he had shown before.

Now, with boundless energy, Paul preached the gospel of the Christ crucified for the sins of all people far and wide, beginning at Jerusalem and continuing all the way to Rome.

It is with this same energy that we want the pupils of St Paul's to encompass the values of our school. As they travel "The St Paul's Way", they travel along pathways to our City of Values. The values are celebrated and evident in all that we do. Our pupils, know and live the values. All members of our community strive to model and demonstrate the values.
