




THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvatio always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.



sing a new song in adoration, and we, with all the host of Angels, cry out, and without end we acclaim:





to be in your presence and minister to you.




Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of

- and all the Saints who have pleased you throughout the ages,






we may merit to be co-heirs to eternal life, and may praise and glorify you through your Son, Jesus Christ.






All Stand

All: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever.










Prayer after Communion
