






Star of silver, sweep across the skies, show where Jesus in the manger lies; shepherds, swiftly from your stupor rise to see the saviour Of the world!


Introduction – Read by Rory.




<u>Preface</u>

And so, with all the Angels, we praise you, as in joyful celebration we acclaim:








Eucharistic Prayer II

At the time he was betrayed and entered willingly into his Passion, he took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:





Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Francis our Pope and Declan our Bishop and all the clergy.



- through your Son, Jesus Christ.



(All Stand)


